I guess you mean Textile, correct? The inline css support is disabled due to security concerns.

Why you try to include here is pure CSS. This is indeed disabled in ChiliProject because it allows anyone to include certain (possibly malformed) CSS and Javascript which can easily lead to a simple to exploit cross site scripting issues.

A workaround we choose at ChiliProject is to include some `[[Extra_CSS|special CSS]]` classes into our theme which can be used to achieve some formatting effects without having to suffer from the above issues. Another possibility would be my "Wiki CSS plugin":<http://dev.holgerjust.de/projects/redmine-wiki-css/wiki> to allows trusted users to add additional CSS to wiki pages.

Having said that, I vote `_Declined_` on this issue.
